Princess Marie named Scandinavia's best goldsmith

H.R.H. Princess Marie named Scandinavia's best goldsmith when she visited Scandinavia's biggest trade fair for jewellery and watches, Copenhagen Jewellery Fair, for which she is patron.

The lucky winner of the prize, the Bella Nordic Jewellery Award, was Nina Meinertz, who trained with Rebecca Falck but who works today at Ole Lynggaard. The award comes with a prize of DKK 50,000.

Together with six other finalists, the winner worked for three days to produce a ring – an assignment which was set by the goldsmith Kim Buck. The finalists are judged, for example, on the basis of excellence, discipline and perseverance.

The second place of Bella Nordic Jewellery Award went to Sanni Jakoleff from Finland and the third place went to Benjamin Hertz Madsen from Denmark.

At the jewellery fair, the most innovative design from a new, young designer was also recognised with the BRAND NEW AWARD. Here, the winner was a Dane, Anne Cohen, who designs rings made of carbon and diamonds. Read more about Anne Cohen at www.annecohen.dk.
